2-YEAR PROGRAM

Description: The CCHS MIGS Fellowship consists of 2 years (22 active of 24 months) of training, including clinical, research and educational programs.

Fellows will work clinically with subspecialists in minimally-invasive surgery, urogynecology, gynecologic oncology, and others to expand on basic knowledge of anatomy, surgical instrumentation, gynecologic problems with surgical remedy, surgical indications, surgical procedures, and clinical outcomes. Patient care will be learned in the office, the operating room and in the hospital to develop a well-rounded knowledge of patient evaluation and preparation, minimally-invasive gynecologic interventions/procedures, and post-intervention care. In the first year fellows will rotate broadly with clinical faculty at multiple sites to gain experience in laparoscopy, robotic surgery, hysteroscopy and vaginal surgery. In the second year fellows may have opportunity to do subspecialty rotations such as

urogynecology, GYN-oncology and minimally-invasive general and colorectal surgery. Program requirements for surgical volume will be assessed prior to participation in other rotations.

During the course of the fellowship, fellows are required to complete a research project suitable for publication. Research training will include research mentorship through the Division of Research, with statistics support by staff epidemiologists. Successful completion of a statistics course is also required. There is an option to complete a Masters in Clinical Research for interested and motivated fellows. Fellows will update teams monthly on research progress. Collaboration with outside institutions is encouraged where appropriate.

Fellows are expected to actively participate in the education of residents, students, and colleagues, in the OR, the classroom, and the simulation lab. At a monthly meeting, fellows and faculty will review current literature likely to impact the field of MIGS. Fellows will provide resident teaching on a monthly basis on relevant MIGS topics as outlined by the MIGS fellowship program. Importantly, fellows will obtain certifications in the Fundamentals of Laparoscopic Surgery at the start of their 2 years, and complete our institutional robotics simulation requirement. They will continue to assist in the simulation training for residents and students monthly, including laparoscopic porcine cadaver labs.

Financial support for the fellowship comes from the departmental duties including Women's Triage shifts (one weekly and 2 weekend shifts per month), additional shifts may be added to fund a Master's program if indicated. These obligations are scheduled outside regular clinical hours in order to have minimal impact on the educational experience.
